This tuition waiver program was co-founded by Honorary Lieutenant-Colonel Kevin Reed and Retired General Rick Hillier in 2009, with the aim to provide financial assistance in the form of tuition waivers to eligible dependents* of Canadian Forces personnel, **deceased while serving in an active military mission**, as determined by Canadian Forces criteria. *dependent status will be determined per Revenue Canada criteria, and confirmed by Canadian Forces.

The recipient(s) of this tuition waiver must be under the age of 26, and must be registered as a full time student in an undergraduate degree program.

The value of this tuition waiver will be in the amount of the recipient's tuition (less ancillary fees), and may be renewed each semester, to a maximum of four years, providing the recipient maintains a satisfactory academic standing.
